Fire Safety Guidelines

If you have requested a Camp Fire supplied by Boundless then you must:

- be 18+ or have a named Supervising Adult who completes the booking with you and will supervise the fire.
- have access to outdoor space where you are able and allowed to make a fire.

You must then observe the following.

You must follow the 'Starting your Camp Fire Safely' instructions provided inside your Signal Fire box.

You will be supplied with a Fire Bowl, a Fire Blanket and a Natural Fire Starter. These items will enable you to have a safe experience and should be used. You will need to source your own burning material, such as dry wood, pre-seasoned logs, BBQ coal, fire brick, or natural fuel such as a coffee block.

Never use flammable liquids to start a Signal Fire. Never burn dangerous items such as aerosol cans, paint tins, foam furniture or batteries.

The Signal Fire should be lit and maintained by the named Signal Fire Lead who will be 18+, (or Supervising Adult). All other audience members should stay 1 metre from the Signal Fire at all times.

Position your Signal Fire clear of any buildings, garden sheds, fences, trees and hedges. You should be able to see clear sky above your fire.

We will supply a fire blanket but always keep a bucket of water nearby in case of emergency to extinguish your fire.

Never leave your fire unattended. An adult should supervise it until it has burnt out. If it has to be left, damp it down with plenty of water. Do not leave it to burn unattended after your October 2020 performance finishes.

Before lighting your fire check the area to make sure there's no wildlife or pets nearby.

Before your Signal Fire you will need to gather:

- Your own burning material, such as drywood, pre-seasoned logs, BBQ coal, instant light fire brick, or natural fuel such as a coffee block
- Paper
- Matches
- A bucket of water
- Torches or phone torches (so you can move around safely after dark)
